## Overview of Survey Results

The survey was completed by over 450 LinkedIn members, in addition to other health and safety professionals during the period February and March 2016.

Chris J Ward presented the interim results of the survey to the BSI OHSAS 18001/45001 Committee at their meeting which took place on 23 March 2016 in London. Amongst those present was David Smith who is chairman of the ISO drafting group which is responsible for producing the standard.

The results show a high level of support for the standard by small organisations, which might be surprising to some observers. Also the indications are that a large number of organisations around the world intend to adopt the new standard even if they are not currently compliant to OHSAS 18001. It should be noted that some of these organisations may operate to their national standards, such as OSHA and AS/NZS4801, however they appear to aspire to meet this new international standard.

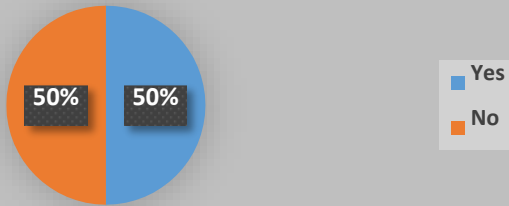

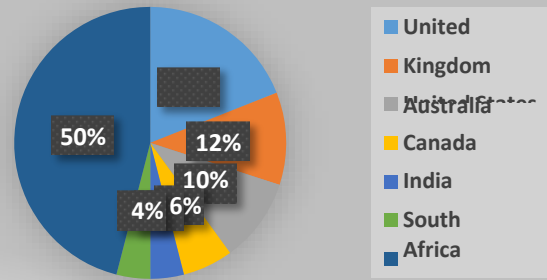

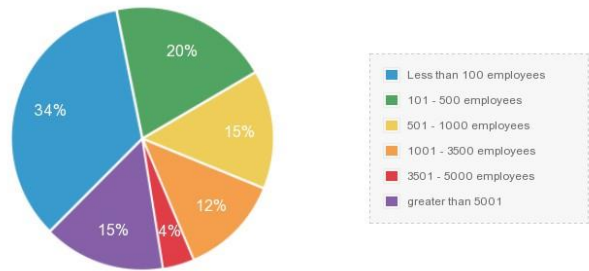
Is your organisation using OHSAS 18001?



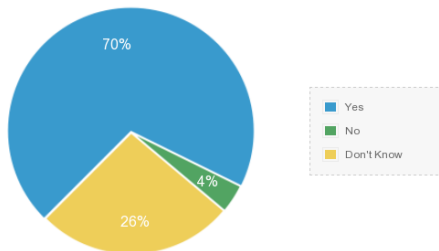
Where is your company's home office?



What is the size of your organisation (in total rather than your particular location)?

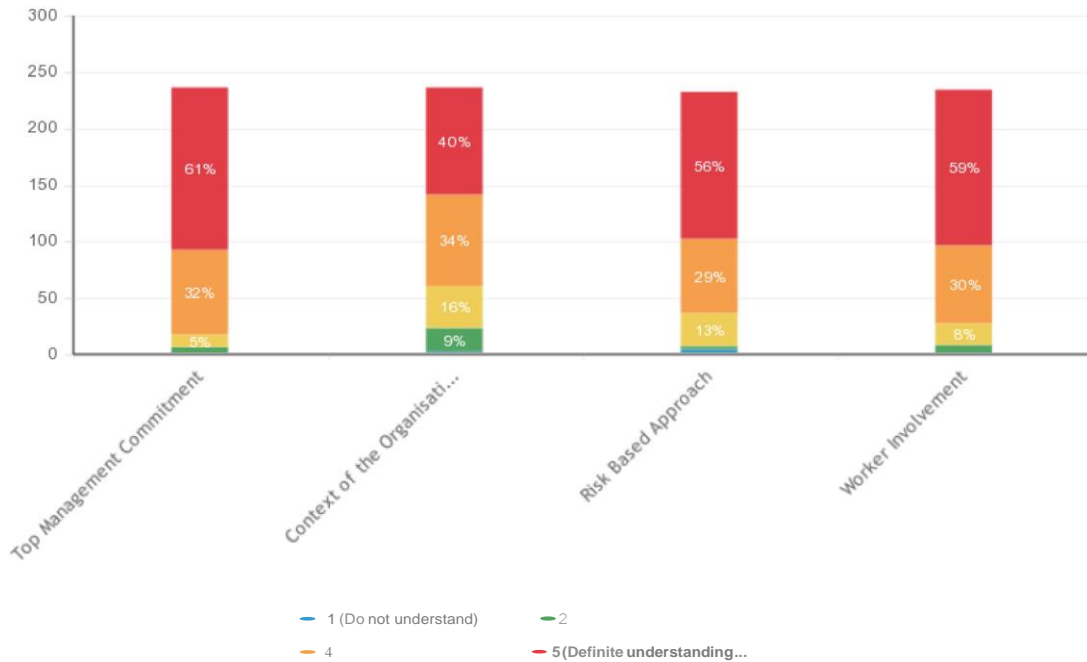


Now that you have seen the draft standard, are you in favour of adopting it for your organisation?
